A copy of the Government orders cited are communicated herewith for necessary action.

The Head of Institutions noted in the dispatch entry are invited to the references cited, wherein the Government vide order 5th cited, have delegated the powers to the Head of Institutions under the control of this Directorate to issue necessary orders pertaining to clinical tie-up for self-financing Nursing / Pharmacy institutions in the respective Districts for all Nursing / Pharmacy courses.

The following guidelines are to be scrupulously followed without any deviation before issue of clinical tie-up for Nursing/Pharmacy institutions with submission of the documents mentioned hereunder:

I. NURSING COURSES - DGNM, B.Sc.(N), P.B.B.Sc(N) & M.Sc(N)

1. Copy of the Govt. Order for starting programme
2. Prescribed Proforma (Enclosed)
3. Copy of the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University Provisional Affiliation (exemption for Deemed to be University)
4. Copy of the Tamil Nadu Nurses and Midwives Council Provisional Affiliation

5. The priority should be given to the Government institution students for clinical training in the Government Hospital / Government Medical College Hospitals.
6. The nursing students of self-financing institutions should be allowed only after collection of prescribed fees as per the orders prescribed in Government order 1st cited.
7. The Nursing Superintendent Grade-I of the respective hospital should maintain the duty roster of the students deputed for clinical training and to monitor the clinical performance of the students.
8. The Nursing Superintendent in charge of the Medical College should depute the self-financing institution students as per their curriculum in three shifts as per the bed strength requirement and should maintain proper attendance register in format for periodical submission to the head of Institution.
9. The Head of Institution should ensure to depute limited number of institutions according to the bed strength of the hospital in order to maintain ample space for observation and study without conjunction of space.
10. The self-financing nursing institutions located within 30 kms radius from the Govt. Medical College Hospitals/except Institute of Mental Health are only eligible to avail clinical training.
11. The institutions should fulfill all the norms and conditions or norms prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council/Government from time to time.
12. The student permit ratio of 1:3 is to be maintained.

(b.) M.Pharm (Pharmacy Practise) & Pharm.D


4. Copy of the Pharmacy Council of India approval.
5. The pharmacy students of self-financing institutions should be allowed only after collection of prescribed fees as per the orders prescribed in Government order 1st cited.
6. Number of institutions which can be attached to one hospital shall be restricted to one and also by the student pharmacist to bed ratio of 1:10 as stipulates in G.O. 2nd & 3rd cited.
